
BE A FRIEND TO AN ASYLUM SEEKER/ASYLEE/REFUGEE.

Fires of Freedom and Cloud of Witnesses Sunday, April 7: 4 PM House of Prayer Lutheran Church - 2100 W. Irwin St., Aliquippa

Our synod's annual commemoration of Dr. King and call for antiracist action will highlight stories of the people, especially women, who kindled the fires of freedom in the Civil Rights Movement. The day includes a panel discussion, youth activity, dinner, and service of Holy Communion where Rev. CeCee Mills of the North Carolina Synod will preach.
