# Stewardship Reflection by Dennis Orsen

Gudina Tumsa from Ethiopia was a classmate of mine at seminary. He went back to his homeland to serve our Lord in the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus during a time of persecution under a communist regime.

Tumsa was elected General Secretary of the denomination. While he was offered

a way to escape, he chose to stay and serve the church that had called him. He disappeared in 1978. For many years, people prayed for his release while suspecting that he was assassinated. No one in the church knew where he was buried, until the regime fell thirteen years later in May 1991. Tumsa died a martyr for the Christian faith.

I share one of his quotes in a pastoral letter he wrote to the church. I believe the quote is universally truthful regardless of the context that we Christians find ourselves:

It is the duty of Christians, as individuals and in congregations, to pray and work for peace and reconciliation. As the body of Christ in the world, the church is made up of many people and various classes. In claiming the name of Christ, we must overcome differences of opinion by dialogue, suspicion by trust, and hatred by love. Such dialogue, trust, and love must be extended to those outside our particular fellowship to Christians of different confessions and to people of other faiths and ideologies.

Dear Senator, / Dear Representative,

I urge you to protect and strengthen nutrition programs that help children reach their full potential.

Specifically, I ask you to:

- Protect, restore, and secure robust funding for global nutrition programs, so that we can reach millions of children with lifesaving assistance.
- Fully fund and strengthen the domestic Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) so that more eligible families in the U.S. are able to enroll and stay enrolled.

For just a small percentage of the federal budget (well under 1 percent), lifesaving aid has an outsized global impact. These strategic investments not only save and improve the lives of tens of millions of children every year, they secure America's standing as a global leader and trusted partner, open new markets to American goods, and reduce national security threats like terrorism and infectious disease.

In 2023 in the U.S. (the last year for which there is data), the WIC program served nearly 7 million participants per month. Participation in WIC is associated with reduced risk of premature birth, low birthweight, and infant mortality.

Genesis 1:27 reminds us that every person is created in God's image, and we honor God when we love our neighbors, especially the most vulnerable among us. In the Gospels, Jesus opens his arms and welcomes children, saying "the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14).

Again, I urge you to protect, restore, and secure robust funding for global child nutrition programs and to fully fund and strengthen WIC in the U.S.

Whether from a fiscal, moral, or faith-based standpoint, the investment in children is more than worth it.
