Pray for Bishop's elections: Our synod, the ELCA and the Roman Catholic Bishop of Rome

Our synod begins the process of electing a bishop on Saturday, May 17. The yearly Synod Assembly will convene that morning for the purpose of nominating candidates. Any ordained minister of word and Sacrament in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America may be nominated. There is an opportunity for nominees to withdraw and to respond to questions. When the assembly gathers from June 12-14, the process will continue.

To state the obvious, the Pope is not Lutheran. We are fortunate to live in times when the Roman Catholic Bishop of Rome has been a global leader for ecumenical relationships and for peace and justice in the world. Let us pray for the Roman Catholic cardinals entrusted with selecting the next pope.



Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has served the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as presiding bishop since her election in 2013 in Pittsburgh. She is now retiring. There will be an election for an ELCA bishop at the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, July 28 through August 2, 2025, in Phoenix, Arizona.

Gracious God, you bless your people with a variety of gifts. Guide with your wisdom those voting members who will elect a bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA. Those voting members who will elect a bishop for the entire Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and those who elect a pope for the Roman Catholic Church. We ask that You raise up faithful servant leaders who will care for your people, equip us for our ministries, speak boldly in the world and guide the church in witness to your love for all people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

One aspect of loving our neighbors is advocacy: Speaking up on behalf of others. Parents do this for their children. In community settings, advocacy is correcting false statements. Don't just be silent when you hear anti-Semitic or anti-Muslim statements and jokes.

ELCA Advocacy and Lutheran Advocacy in Pennsylvania (LAMPa) help us bring a Christian voice to government, especially the way our government is part of caring for the hungry, the poor, the oppressed, the sick, the persecuted and refugees. You can get sample letters on time-sensitive issues which you may send as-is, or rewrite with your own experience, or use as a basis for a phone call to your representatives and senators.

Advocacy ministry in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is based on ELCA Social Statements and social policy resolutions and the ELCA Constitution. Articles 4.02 and 4.031 state: "This church shall advocate dignity and justice for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among nations, and standing with the poor and powerless and committing itself to their need ... This church shall study social issues and trends, work to discover the causes of oppression and injustice, and develop programs of ministry and advocacy to further human dignity, freedom, justice, and peace in the world."

Our synod will elect a new bishop at this year's synod assembly. Bishop Kusserow has served well and faithfully for 18 years as our bishop. He is ready to retire.

The voting participants from Emmanuel are Helen Williams, Pastor Dennis Orsen, and Pastor Linda Theophilus.

The business of assembly includes elections to synod council, several committees of the synod and agencies of the synod. There is a budget to be approved. There will also be learning forums on a variety of topics. The churchwide representative is Deacon Sue Rothmeyer, the secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The synod assembly chaplain is a son of Emmanuel, the Rev. Blair Morgan, who grew up in Eastmont.
